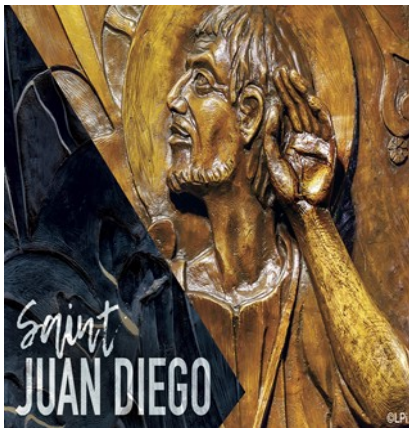

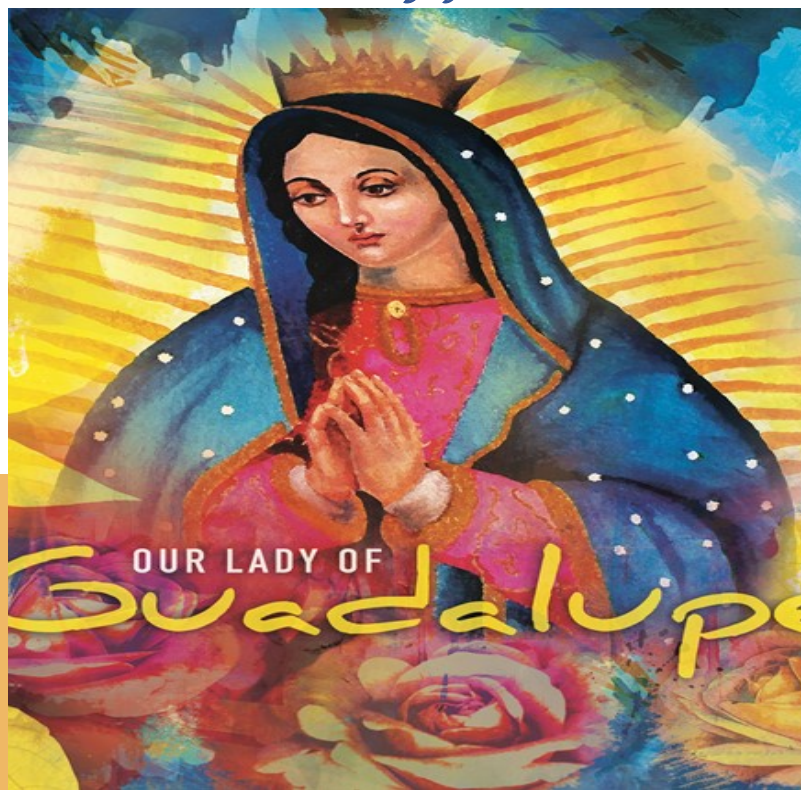
ST. GENEVIEVE'S MISSION STATEMENT

3rd Precept: To receive Holy Communion at least during Easter season.

4th Precept: To observe days of fasting and abstinence especially during Lent.

5th Precept: Providing for the needs of the Church through financial giving and charitable acts.

2nd Sunday of Advent
 Luke 3:1-6

Blessed Advent to you all!

Today we continue the "joyful expectation" of the birth of Christ in history, the present, and the future. Today we hear the words of John the Baptist calling people of his time to repentance. Now, this baptism that John was calling people to is not the same baptism that we Christians celebrate. However, John's baptism is at the root of our Christian baptism. John's baptism had its roots in the "oblation washing" of the Jewish people before undertaking anything of great importance.

Christian baptism is a sacrament to wash away original sin so as to enter sinless into the Christian community. It is the one sacrament that is celebrated by all Christians, even those Christians who are not in communion with Rome.

John enjoins us to "prepare the way of the Lord." His call is to be taken in the widest sense. This preparation is a personal preparation, and is also a communal preparation. We are called to make sure we are ready to meet the Lord, and this means that we need to make a difference in the world to make it better, to make it more peaceful, and to make it more just. We are called to protect each other's dignity and share of our abundance with others so that each may live a life that is centered on helping others.

Bendito Adviento a todos!

Hoy continuamos la "esperanza gozosa" del nacimiento de Cristo en la historia, el presente y el futuro. Hoy escuchamos las palabras de Juan el Bautista llamando a la gente de su tiempo al arrepentimiento. Ahora, este bautismo al que Juan estaba llamando a la gente no es el mismo bautismo que nosotros los cristianos celebramos. Sin embargo, el bautismo de Juan está en la raíz de nuestro bautismo cristiano. El bautismo de Juan tuvo sus raíces en el "lavado de la oblación" del pueblo judío antes de emprender cualquier cosa de gran importancia.

El bautismo cristiano es un sacramento para lavar el pecado original para entrar sin pecado en la comunidad cristiana. Es el único sacramento que es celebrado por todos los cristianos, incluso aquellos cristianos que no están en comunión con Roma.

Juan nos exhorta a "preparar el camino del Señor. Su llamado debe ser tomado en el sentido más amplio. Esta preparación es una preparación personal y también es una preparación comunal. Estamos llamados a asegurarnos de estar listos para encontrarlos con el Señor, y esto significa que debemos hacer una diferencia en el mundo para hacerlo mejor, para hacerlo más pacífico y para hacerlo más justo. Estamos llamados a proteger la dignidad de los demás y compartir nuestra abundancia con los demás para que cada uno pueda vivir una vida centrada en ayudar a los demás.
